My name is Keturah Johnson and I would like to formally introduce myself and announce that I am running for the office of the AFA International Vice President. I am asking for your vote and support. On March 2, 2022, we successfully ratified our new contract after a historic 100% strike vote. We centered the voices of Flight Attendants who were fed up with the exploitation at Piedmont. We sought and received the support of the International office, staff, and our siblings within AFA, who all stood with us in solidarity. Along with my duties as Local 61 President/MECP, I have served on the AFA International Budget Committee for the last two years. Prior to joining Piedmont, I served in the military with the Pennsylvania National Guard from 2009-2015 and completed one tour to Afghanistan from 2010-2011.
